ADMISSION: Boys and girls going into grades 1-11. Mini-Camp is for rising 1st-6th graders only.

RISING 11th GRADERS do NOT register online or with this application. They *must* apply to be a Service Camper. Please request the Service Camper application as this fills quickly. A description of the position is on our website under forms.

RISING 10th GRADERS may register online or with this application but are considered Leaders-in-Training. They will take an additional activity on leadership skills and help with simple chores each day. A description is on our website under forms.

OPEN HOUSE: Open House is in the spring. Check website for exact date.

FEES: Our fee is ALL-INCLUSIVE: tuition, all activities, room and board, t-shirt, canteen treats, most ground transportation from Greenville/Spartanburg (GSP) airport (except one-week sessions), trip admissions (two-, three- and four-week sessions), postage for letters home, and photo gallery. There is an optional additional fee for parents to email your camper or purchase photos.

DISCOUNTS: sibling discount of \$50 per week after the first child, \$50 referral discount, and discount for Service Campers, who must fill out a Service Camper application. (Look on our website for a printable copy.) Contact us for how you can earn discounts for recruiting new campers.

BILLING: A \$450 deposit for 2-, 3- or 4-week sessions, a \$250 deposit for 1-week sessions, or a \$150 deposit for Mini-Camp must accompany each application and will be credited to tuition. Payments may be made monthly or in one sum. Final payment is due before your session begins. We accept checks, debit cards and most credit cards.

REFUNDS: Your deposit and tuition are fully refundable if you must cancel. We do deduct a \$50 processing fee. Please note that if you don't notify us of a cancellation, all monies paid will be forfeited. If a camper is sent home for behavior, there will be no refund.

TRANSPORTATION: For Opening and Closing Day times, check website. We meet airline flyers at the Greenville/Spartanburg Airport (GSP) ONLY. The airport is one and a half hours from camp. Book flights to arrive and depart between 10:00 a.m and 2:30 p.m. A \$75 fee per family will be added for times that fall outside of this time frame.

INFORMATION PACKAGE: You will receive informational emails and a mailing, including your Parent Handbook, before your session begins. Campers will receive a Camper Packet before their arrival.

CAMPER GUIDELINES: All campers must read (or have read to them) the Camper Guidelines that is sent to camper in their information packet and is also available on the website. When you sign the agreement on the application, you are stating that your camper has read and agrees to abide by the regulations outlined in the Guidelines.

ACTIVITIES: Activities are included in tuition, including horseback, waterski and crafts. Campers will choose their own activities online before they arrive at camp from over thirty choices. An email with this information will be sent to you before their arrival.

TRIPS: All campers in Sessions A, B, BC1 and BC get a trip that emphasizes experiences a camper cannot easily find at home. Depending on the camper's number of years at Chatuga, trips may include visiting Stumphouse Tunnel, innertubing or swimming on the Chattooga River, viewing Tallulah Gorge, rafting on the Nantahala River, taking a canopy zipline tour, or rafting Section 3 of the Chattooga River. Trip for **Session C** (also the second trip for Session BC) is an all-camp roller-skating party. No trip in one-week sessions, except for Session C2 which goes rollerskating. We require \$25 spending money for these trips and \$15 for roller-skating.

HEALTH: Health form must be completed either online or on paper prior to attending camp. Chatuga's infirmary, with a full-time health supervisor, provides for onsite needs. Health needs that require doctor's visits, prescriptions, x-rays, or emergency room visits will be billed to parents. All other health-related information can be found in the Parent Handbook.

LOCATION: Chatuga is ten miles northwest of Walhalla off Hwy. 28 in the northwestern corner of SC (five miles from GA and five miles from NC). Two hours north of Atlanta; 1½ hours west of Greenville, SC; 3 hours southwest of Charlotte.

MISCELLANEOUS: The camp reserves the right to use any photographs, videos, writings, quotations, etc. of campers, staff, and parents to promote Chatuga. Camp Chatuga is not responsible for personal belongings and money while in transit or in camp or if lost or damaged by fire, theft, etc.
