

CAMP CHATUGA

Leader-in-Training/Service Camper Information

QUALIFICATIONS: To attend as a rising 10th grader at Camp Chatuga, you may register online. To attend as a rising 11th grader, you must apply as a Service Camper and fill out a separate application. If you are a first-time camper, you must submit two references from teachers, coaches, church leaders, or other leaders in your community who know you.

SESSIONS: All Service Campers must attend at least a two-week session, and may attend three or four weeks. LITs may attend one or two sessions for any number of weeks.

TO APPLY: Read this paper thoroughly and complete the application (LIT's apply online). Return it ASAP **with a deposit check of \$450**. We limit the number of Service Camper positions which fill quickly.

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS: Many past LITs and Service Campers have found that their Chatuga service counts for volunteer hours for schools or scouts which require community service. Bring any paperwork related to volunteer hours to your session for us to complete.

FUTURE RESUME: Being a Service Camper or LIT shows maturity, ability to follow directions, good judgment, responsibility, initiative and independence. We provide future job references as needed. Being a successful Service Camper or LIT can also help you become a part of Chatuga staff in the future.

LIT JOB DESCRIPTION

Rising 10th grade

LITs spend about an hour of their camp time each day volunteering in work and taking a leadership class; the rest is as a regular camper with their cabin group and doing their daily activities.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Be a good role model for all campers by supporting Chatuga verbally, following the rules, participating enthusiastically in activities, special events, and work, and going the extra mile.
2. Have office duties which may include greeting visitors, using the copier, sweeping, stuffing envelopes, cleaning bathrooms, filing, etc.
3. Assist on Opening Day, set up for some special events, and help in the kitchen for Special Dinner.
4. Have assigned duties including canteen helper, slip-n-slide, canoe monitor, infirmary helper, etc.
5. Substitute for staff in cabins and tables, keeping safety of campers in mind.
6. Assist as asked in any other area of responsibility.

SERVICE CAMPER JOB DESCRIPTION

Rising 11th grade

Service Campers attend for \$400 off the regular fee. Early enrollment and sibling discounts do not apply. Service Campers spend about a fourth of their camp time working; the rest is as a regular camper with their cabin group and doing their daily activities.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Do kitchen duties which will include washing dishes, wiping tables, mopping, serving food, setting tables, sweeping, supervising campers, lifting and unloading boxes, etc.
2. Be a good role model for all campers by supporting Chatuga verbally, following the rules, participating enthusiastically in activities, special events, and work, and going the extra mile.
3. Substitute for LITs when needed.
4. Substitute for staff in cabins and some activities. Must substitute only for those things qualified to do, keeping the safety of campers foremost in mind.
5. Enforce safety standards in all areas.
