Service Camper Information

QUALIFICATIONS: To attend as a rising 11th grader, you must submit a *separate Service Camper application*. If you are a first-time camper as a Service Camper, you must submit a phone contact for two references from teachers, coaches, church leaders, or other leaders in your community who know you.

SESSIONS: All Service Campers must attend for at least a two-week session and may attend for three or four weeks.

TO APPLY: Read this paper thoroughly and complete the application. We limit the number of Service Camper positions each session which fill quickly.

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS: Many past Service Campers have found that their Chatuga service counts for volunteer hours for schools or scouts which require community service. Bring any paperwork related to volunteer hours to your session for us to complete.

FUTURE RESUME: A successful Service Camper exhibits maturity, good judgement, initiative, the ability to follow directions, responsibility, and independence. Future job references are provided as needed. Successful Service Campers will be invited to apply as Campers-In-Transition (CITs) the following year as rising 12th graders and other future Chatuga staff positions.

SERVICE CAMPER DESCRIPTION

Rising 11th grade

Service Campers attend for \$200 a week off the regular fee. Other discounts do not apply. Service Campers spend about a fourth of their camp time working; the rest is as a regular camper with their cabin group and doing their daily activities.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Perform kitchen duties which will include setting tables, serving food, washing dishes, wiping tables, sweeping, lifting and unloading boxes, etc.
2. Be a good role model for all campers by supporting Chatuga verbally, following the rules, participating enthusiastically in activities, special events, and work, and going the extra mile.
3. Substitute for Leaders-in-Training (LITs) when needed.
4. Substitute for staff in cabins and some activities. Must substitute only for those things qualified to do, keeping the safety of campers foremost in mind.
5. Enforce safety standards in all areas.
